



License

- Roast coffee or conduct these activities: manufacture, process, treat, preserve, grade, package, or label food
- Roast coffee for sale over the internet
- *Import* roasted coffee or coffee products
- Export coffee [require export certificate, export to the U.S.]

Inter-provincial Trade (distributors)

- License NOT required if distribution is the only activity
- Validate importer or supplier has valid CFIA license
- Must implement traceability provisions

Preventive Controls

- Hazard Analysis: Chemical, Biological, Physical
- Sanitation, Pest Control & Control of Non-food Chemical Agents
- Conveyances & Equipment
- Conditions Respecting Establishments
 - Land
 - Interior of facility or conveyance
 - Design, construction and maintenance of establishment
 - Separation of food
 - Lighting
 - Ventilation systems
 - Temperature and humidity
 - Removal & disposal of contaminated materials & waste
 - Cleaning stations, lavatories
 - Water
- Unloading, Loading and Storing
- Competencies and Qualifications
- Hygiene
 - Clothing, footwear & protective coverings
 - Personal cleanliness
 - Spitting, chewing gum & other acts
 - Reporting of disease, illness, symptoms & lesions

Preventive Control Plan

- Describe biological, chemical & physical hazards
- Description of control measures
- Description of critical control points
- Critical limits for each critical control point
- Procedures for monitoring the critical control points
- Corrective action for each critical control point
- Procedures for verifying implementation results in compliance to SFCR
- Documents verifying the preventive control plan was implemented

Measures ensuring food is packaged and labelled in compliance

Traceability



- Data receive from supplier
- Data maintained by coffee roaster
- Data provided to customer
- Use of lot codes or product identifiers
- Retention time for data



Ten Questions to Percolate On !!!

- 1. For traceability purposes, when MUST the unique product identifier be a "lot code"?
- 2. When can a U.S. non-resident importer export roasted coffee directly from the European Union to Canada?
- 3. Under what circumstances can a non-resident importer from the European Union export roasted coffee or coffee products from the European Union to Canada?
- 4. Does CFIA currently charge an inspection fee for the importation of roasted coffee or coffee products into Canada?

Ten Questions to Percolate On !!!

- 4. Can a U.S. non-resident importer to Canada export green coffee beans directly from Columbia to Canada?
- 5. Does a coffee roaster require a CFIA license if all of party's roasted coffee is sold in the province in which the roasting establishment is located?
- 6. What product information MUST a coffee distributor provide to their customer?
- 7. Green coffee beans are being stored in a transport trailer next to the roasting facility. In this instance, is the transport trailer a conveyance or considered part of the establishment?

- 8. What two options may be used for identity authentication when enrolling in MyCFIA?
- 9. Under what circumstances would a small coffee roaster require a CFIA license if they sell 100% of their coffee over the internet?
- 10. Would an importer require a CFIA license to import green coffee beans if the green coffee beans are imported in a consumer pre-packaged format?
